







It is believed this picture was taken at the Kelley Farm House East of St. Patrick's Church near Corning. John E. McCauley's Mother Mary "Hagerty" *McCauley* remarried Patrick Kelley and this was their farm house. Dorothy related to her grandkids that she was born in this house.

JAMES MAHAN SR.

James Mahan sr., 84, 12 East Hefron St., died Sunday morning at the Veterans Administration Hospital at Marion, Ind. He had been ill for four years and seriously ill three weeks.

A retired farmer, Mr. Mahan was a member of St. Simon Catholic Church and the Burch Wood Post, American Legion. He had served in the U.S. Army in World War I.

He was born Sept. 18, 1888 in Reeve township, son of Thomas and Mary (Donahue) Mahan, and attended Daviess county schools. In 1922 he married Dorothy McCauley who survives.

He leaves one son, James A. Mahan, Washington, two daughters, Mrs. Fred (Agnes) Watkins, Bradenton, Fla., and Mrs. James (Mildred) Hanson, Indianapolis, 14 grand-children, six great grandchildren, one brother, John Mahan, Washington, and two sisters, Irene Mahan, Washington, and Mrs. Charles (Mae) Nalin, Evansville. One daughter, Rosemary, two sisters and one brother have died.

Services will be at 10 a.m. Wednesday at St. Simon Church with burial in St. John cemetery. Friends may call at the Ed L. Lee Mortuary. Members of St. Simon parish and friends will pray a Rosary at 8 p.m. today.
