LAWRENCE & AGNES “HEALY” KAVANAUGH FAMILY

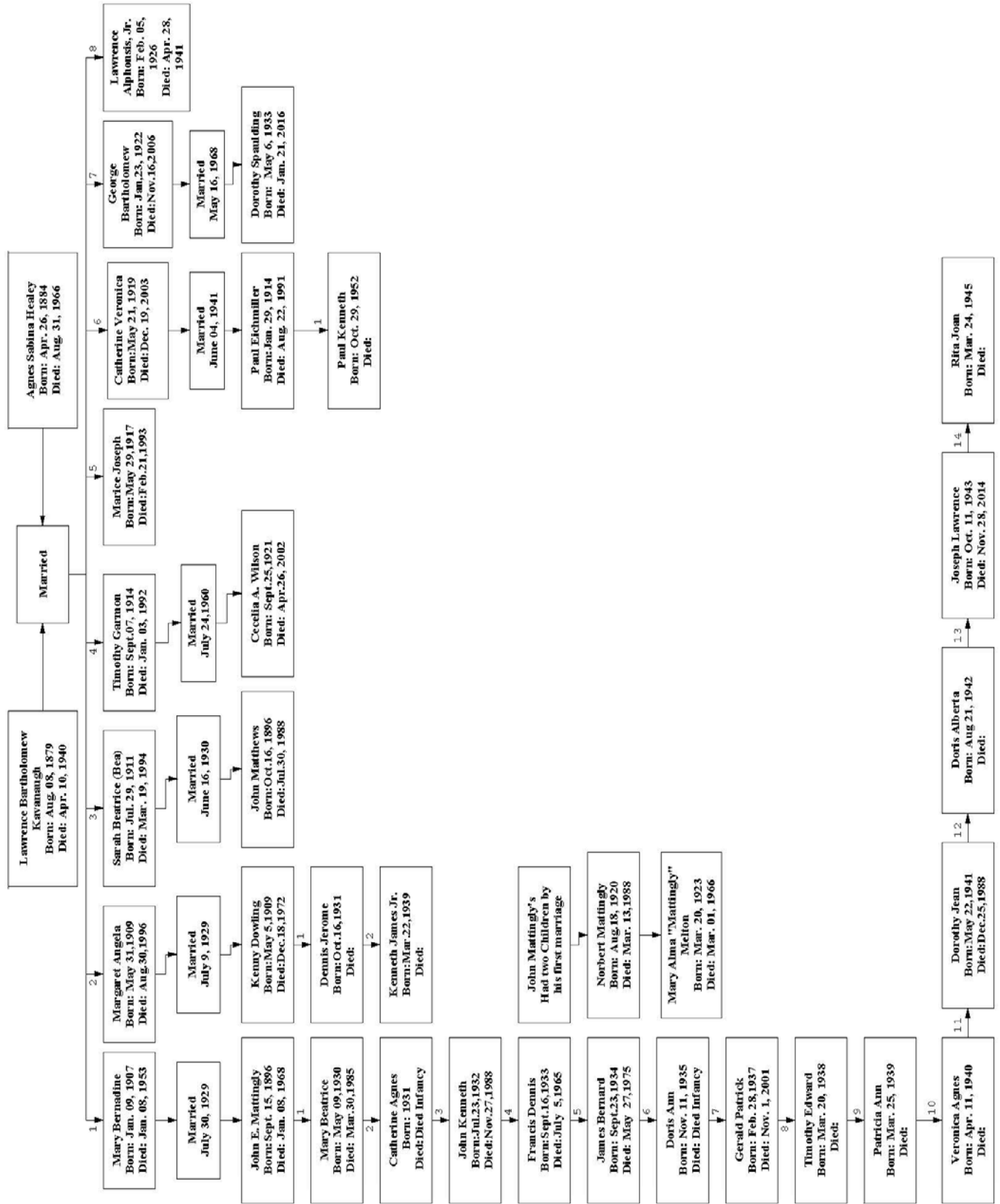
Lawrence Kavanaugh was the son of Timothy and Margaret “Nolan” Kavanaugh and he inherited the Kavanaugh home place of Timothy and Margaret on County Rd. 100 North just about a quarter mile west of Cannelburg. Timothy and Margaret had made it their home and raised their children on this farm and it was then passed on to their son Lawrence who raised his family on this farm. Lawrence’s brother Pat and his wife Julie owned a farm just north east of Lawrence’s farm and it bordered along their farm. Lawrence’s other brother John and his wife Mary Lucy Kavanaugh owned a farm just west of them and bordering Lawrence’s farm. Lawrence and Agnes raised 8 children, Mary Bernadine, Angela, Bea, Timothy, Joe, Veronica, George and Lawrence Jr. Lawrence also had a brother who was a Catholic Priest, (Father Timothy Kavanaugh) and a sister Margaret who never married and he had

another sister (Mary Ellen) who died at six years of age who suffered burns from scalding water. The story was told that she knocked a boiling pan of water off the stove on herself and later died from the burns. Lawrence’s son Lawrence Jr. died at the young age of 15 of cancer. Lawrence & Agnes children remained in the Cannelburg area except for Angela who moved to Detroit Michigan. Bernadine married John Mattingly and lived in St. Mary’s area of Barr-Township. As the story was related to me when the family had planned to take Lawrence Jr. to a special doctor in Illinois in April of 1940 they went to wake Lawrence Sr. and found he had passed away in his sleep at the age of 61. Agnes continued to live on the home place until her death in 1966.

L. B. KAVANAUGH FOUND DEAD IN BED IN BARR TP.

Funeral Friday Morn- ing For Respected Farmer.

Lawrence B. Kavanaugh, 69, Barr township farmer, died at his Home near Cannelburg last night following a three month's illness.

Mr. Kavanaugh was found dead in bed about 5 o'clock this morning. Death caused by ailments from which he had been suffering, probably occurred soon after he retired last night. Dr. C. p. Seudder, coroner said following an inquest.

Mr. Kavanaugh was born in Cannelburg on August 8, 1880 and was a respected farmer of the Barr Township community. His Parents were Timothy and Margaret A. (Nolan) Kavanaugh, both natives of Ireland. He was a member of all Saints Church in Cannelburg.

Living children are Timothy G. Joseph M., Veronica, George B and Lawrence A. Kavanaugh all at home; Mrs. John Mattingly of Loogootee; Mrs. Kenneth Dowling of Cannelburg and Mrs. John Matthews of Loogootee. He leaves three brothers and a sister. The Rev. Father Timothy E. Kavanaugh and Mrs. Margaret Kavanaugh of Rushville; Patrick W. Kavanaugh of Cannelburg and John T. Kavanaugh of Detroit. One sister is dead. Ten grandchildren survive.

Funeral services will be held at 9 o'clock Friday morning at All Saints Church in Cannelburg with burial in St. Peter's cemetery at Montgomery.

The body will be taken from the Norris Funeral Home in Loogootee to the home of a daughter, Mrs. Kenneth Dowling

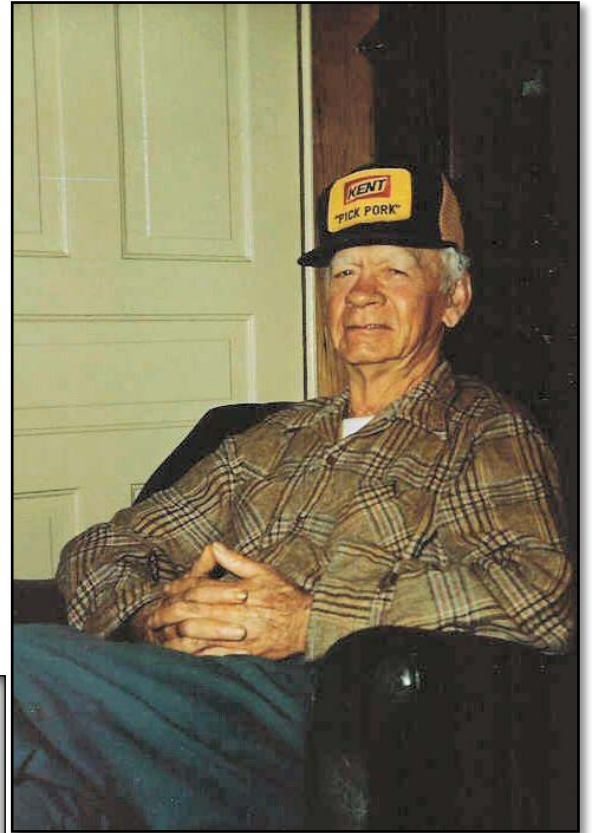
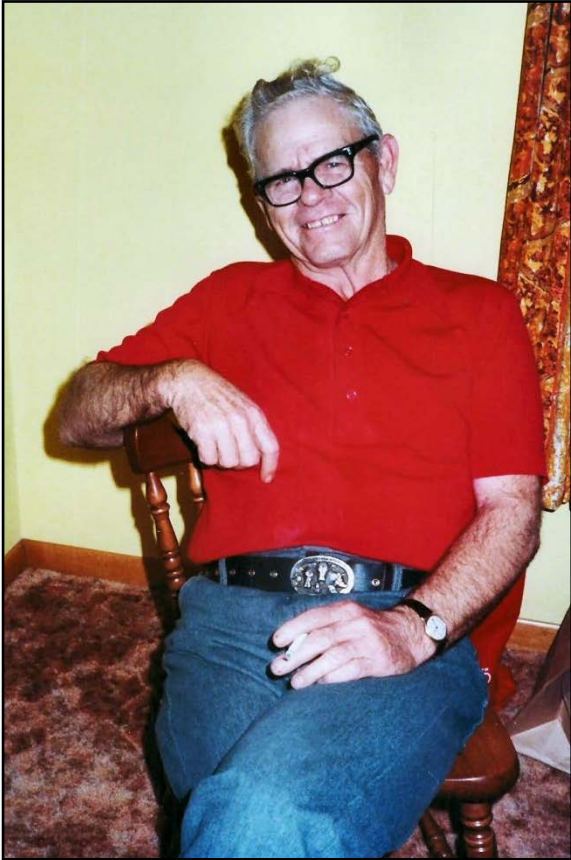

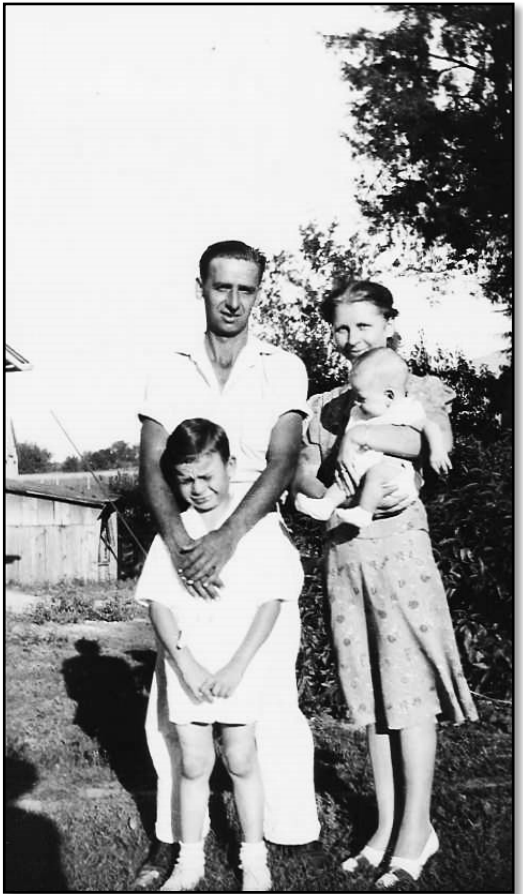

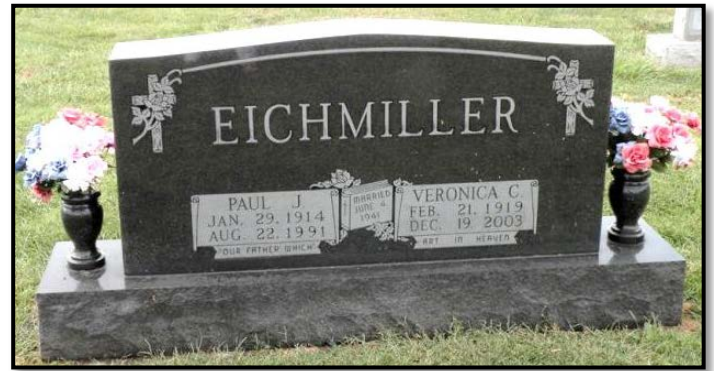

Death came to Mrs. Mary B. Mattingly, wife of John Mattingly, owner and operator of the Mattingly Feed Store, northwest of Loogootee, on Sunday morning at 9:15 o'clock. Her passing came in the Daviess county hospital after an illness of only 36 hours.

She died at the early age of 47 years. A daughter of the late Lawrence Kavanaugh and Agnes Healy-Kavanaugh of Cannelburg. She was born there in January, 1906, and had spent her life time in the communities surrounding Loogootee. She married Mr. Mattingly on July 30, 1928.
