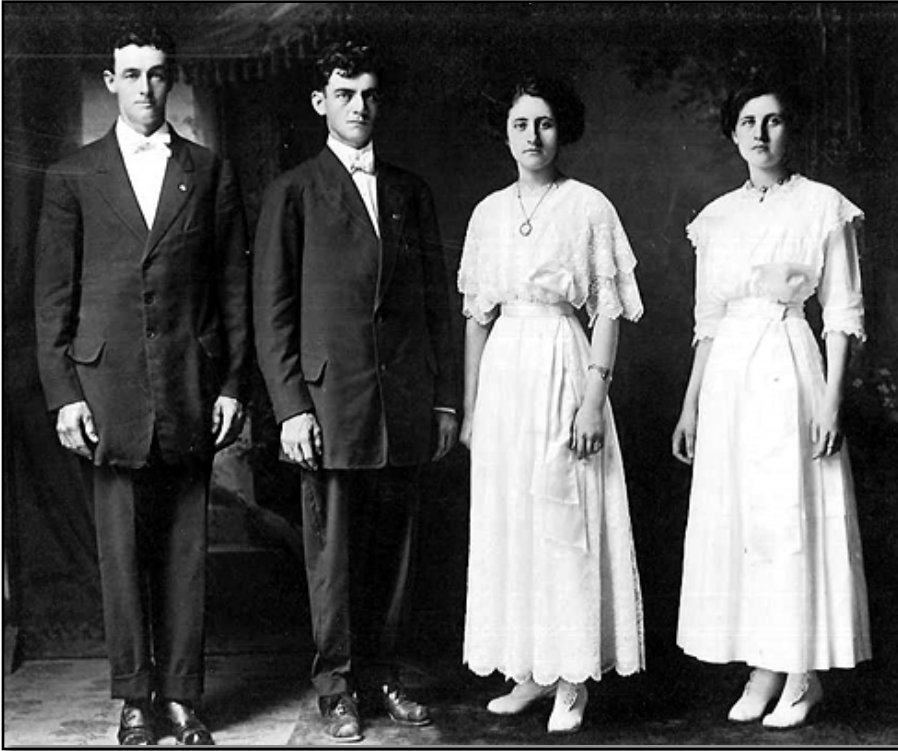

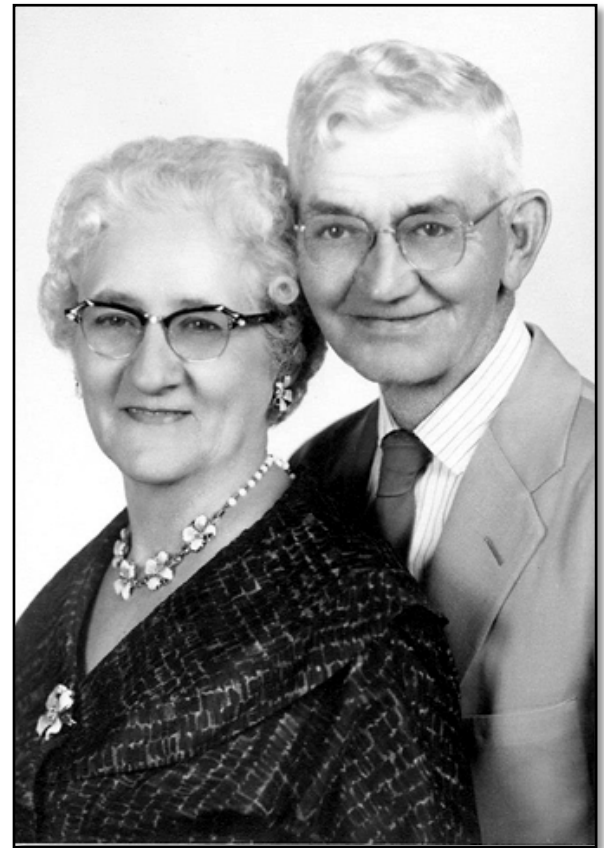
John & Cora (Mudd) O'Connor Family

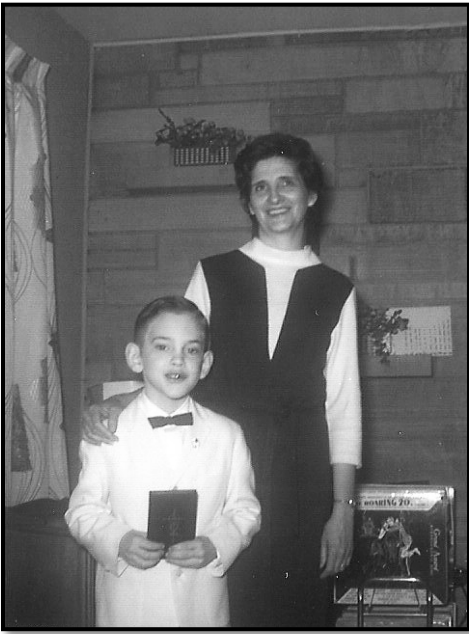

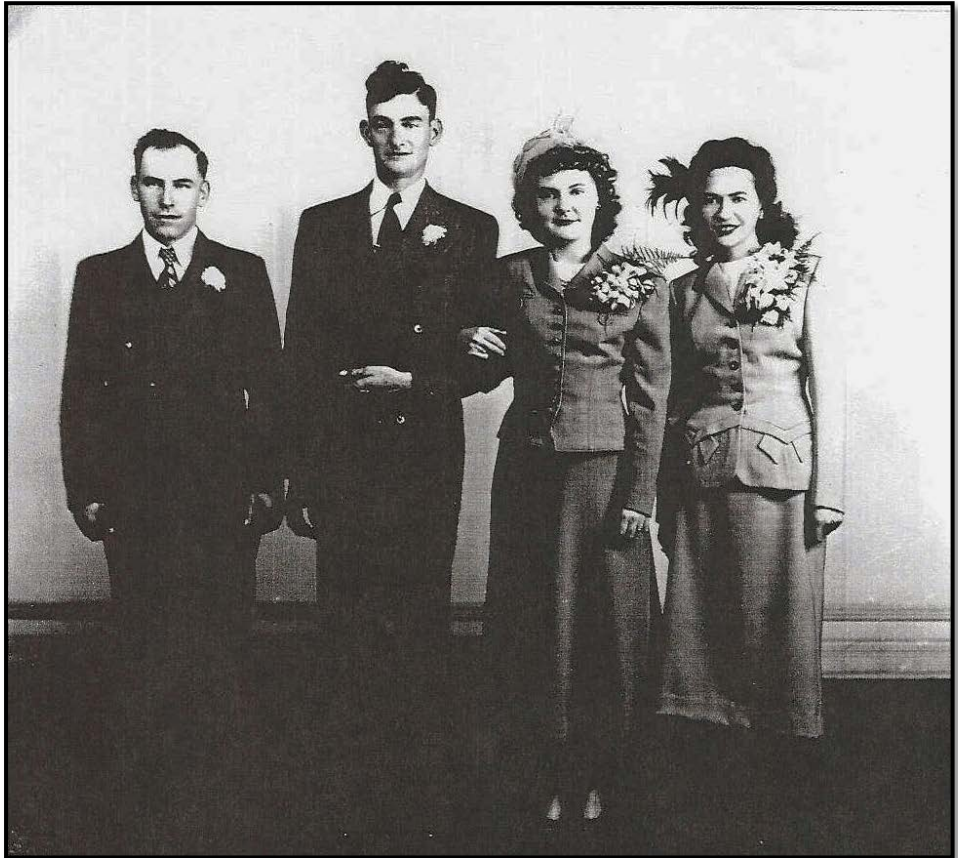

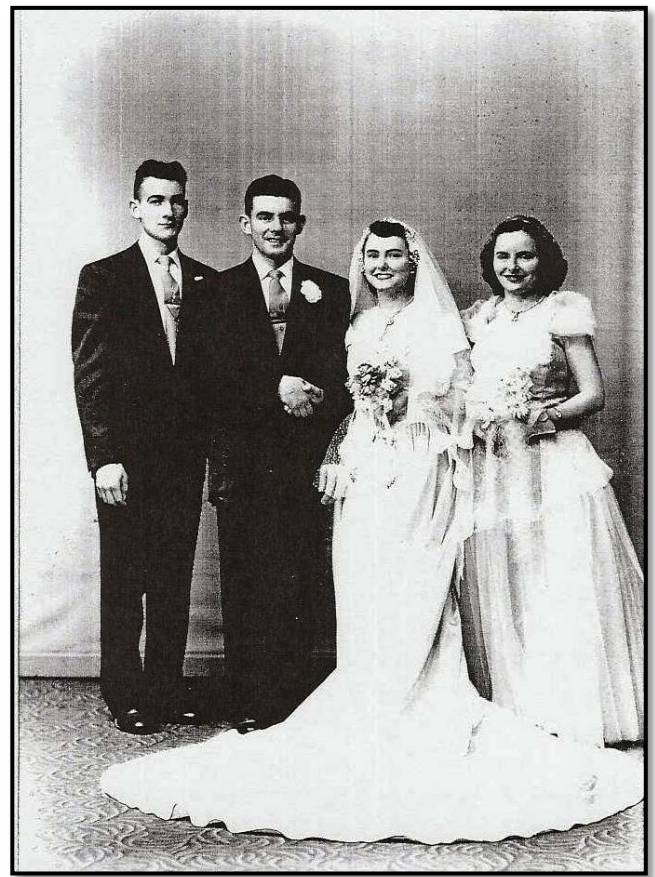

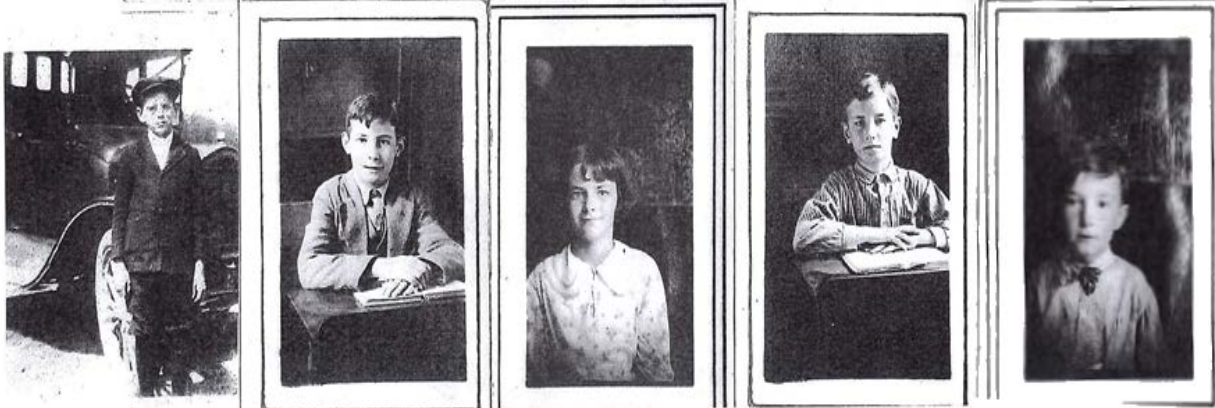
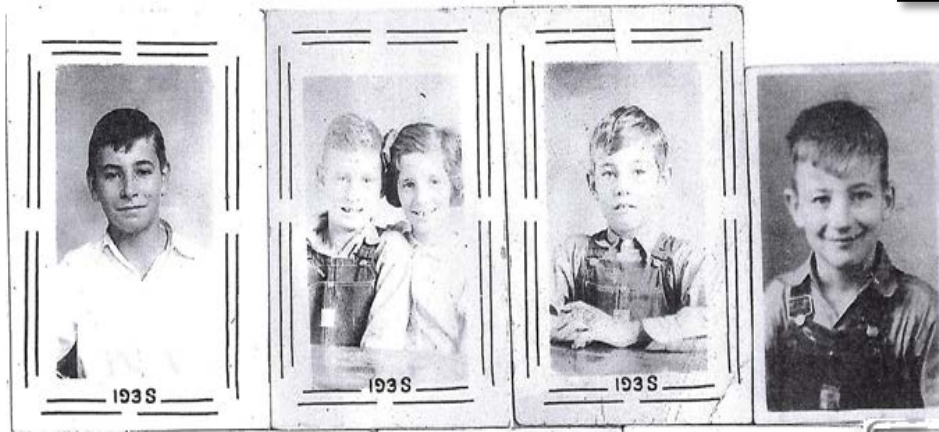

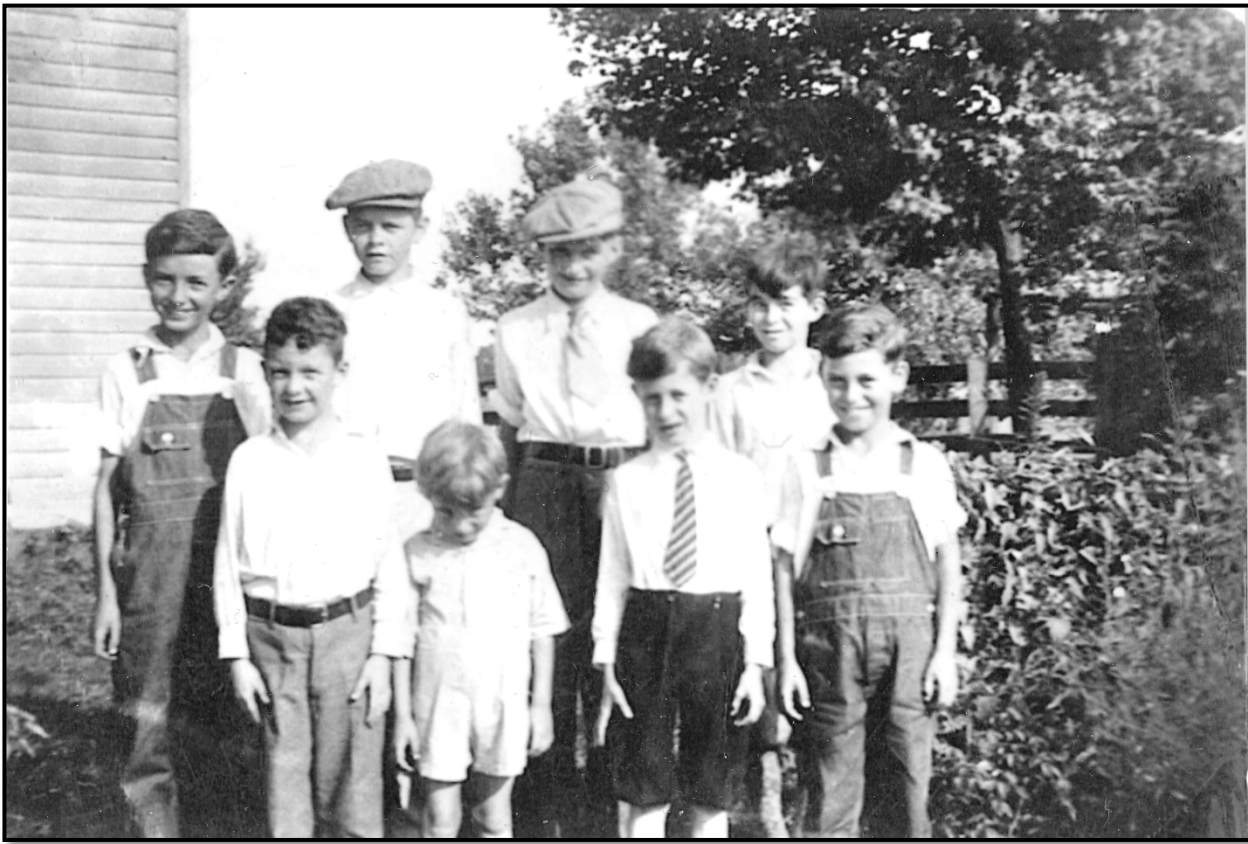
