Parents and Family Members of Louis Michaels




On the back of the picture, it was written James Michaels, Sept. 25, 1848 – April 28, 1880. Married Mary Elizabeth Zinkan April 20, 1875. This Picture was in the possession of James "Gus" & Josephine Michaels. James & Mary "Zinkan" Michaels' son was Louis Michaels, who married Mary Frances "Matthews." Their son was James Augustine "Gus" Michaels. He had four children and one of them was Elizabeth "Michaels" Kavanaugh.

On the back of the picture, it was written Mary Elizabeth "Zinkan" Michaels, Dec. 20, 1849 - April 22, 1939. Married James Michaels April 20, 1875, Also known as Mary Elizabeth Mackell. This Picture was in the possession of James "Gus" & Josephine Michaels. James & Marv "Zinkan" Michaels' son was Louis Michaels, who married Mary Frances "Matthews." Their son was James Augustine "Gus" Michaels. He had four children and one of them was Elizabeth "Michaels" Kavanaugh.







Michael Lundergan & Anna "Michaels" Family



Pictured, is the Michael & Anna "Michaels" Lundergan Family. Anna was a sister to Louis Michaels and Louis was the father of Gus Michaels. Michael and Anna Michaels had 13 children. I am not sure where I got this picture but it appears it was from Ancestry.com and it had a list of the children and their date of birth and date of passing. As you can tell this picture had some of the names written on the picture above or close to the individuals but we cannot id all that is in this picture. Below the children are listed in order of birth to the best of our knowledge: 12 children are in this picture but we believe one died at birth.

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Modern Tombstone for James Mackell/Mary Elizabeth "Zinkan": I know the tombstone says "Michael", but the dates match up for James and Elizabeth "Zinkan" Mackell. When this stone was erected, they probably thought they were putting up a stone for the Michaels family and probably misspelled it.

There has always been some confusion and discussion after the Mackells came to America and why the name changed from Mackell to Michaels. To add to the confusion, on this tombstone the name at the top says "Michael". The "S" is left off. It is believed this stone was placed there years after their death, because near the opposite side of the grave is the tombstone for James C. Michaels Father, James A. & Mary "Campbell" Mackell.

Tombstone for James A. & Mary "Campbell" Mackell. On this Tombstone, it reads "James Mackell, a Native of Co. Derry, Ireland, Died Feb 28, 1880, Aged 71 years. That would make his date of birth around 1809. The Mackells were the parents of James Mackell, who was the father of Louis Michaels, who was the father of Gus Michaels. Note the difference in name spelling from James Mackell to Louis Michaels, so far we have not come up with a good explanation on that.

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
On the other side of the Tombstone is printed the information for his wife, Mary "Campbell" Mackell. It reads "Mary Mackell, a Native of Co. Derry, Ireland, Died Feb. 28, 1880, Aged 61 Years". That would make her date of birth around 1819. It appeared the husband and wife died within 15 days of each other. This tombstone is located in St. Peters Cemetery in Montgomery, in the middle of the center section.

Michael Matthew Sr. and His Wife Ellen Owen.




Michael Matthews and Ellen Owen, parents of Joseph P., Owen, James, Margaret, Mary Ellen, Edward, Ann, John, Michael Jr. and three infants who died.

They settled in St. Mary's in 1838, traveling by covered wagon from Baltimore, Maryland. Michael was born in Co. Langford, Ireland in 1802. Ellen, his wife, was born in Virginia in 1814. Enroute to St. Mary's, they stopped in Jefferson County, Indiana (Madison?) where their first child Owen, was born on January 17, 1838. They came to Vincennes and purchased 80 acres of U.S. government land for \$2.00 per acre on August 1, 1839 in section 9, near St. Mary's. Their son Joseph became the first student for the priesthood from St. Mary's parish.

Michael & Ellen's son, Michael Jr., married Barbara Soeder and their daughter, Mary Frances Matthews, married Louis Michaels. Their son, Gus Michaels, married Josephine Laux and their children were: Jim, Mary Jo, Tom and Elizabeth Ann. That is the Family Tree link.

Tombstone for Michael P. Matthews Sr.& Margaret Ellen "Owens" Matthews






Tombstone for Michael P. Matthews Sr. and Ellen "Owens". This tombstone is located in St. Mary's Barr-Twp. Cemetery off County Road 1000 East. Michael Matthews Sr. was born in 1802 and died on May 20, 1874. The stones say Michael Sr. died at 72 years of age and was a native of County Longford, Ireland. On the other side of this stone (left), is the stone for Ellen "Owens", his wife who was born in 1802 and died on April 3, 1886.

Note: Mathews is spelled with just one "T" which is not uncommon for various spellings. May have been the way Matthews spelled their last name when they came to the America.

Michael P. Matthews Sr. & Ellen Owens Matthews were the parents of Michael Matthews Jr., who was the Father of Mary Frances "Matthews" Michaels who was the mother of Gus Michaels.



Pictured above and below, are pictures and information about Father Joseph **P. Matthews.** He was the first Pastor at St. Michael's Catholic Church. He began his service in 1888 and went into the 1900s. He was a brother to Michael Matthews Jr., who was the grandfather of Gus Michaels. Gus's Great Uncle, Father Matthews, was a popular Pastor at St. Michael's Church.



When the automobile came, Father Matthews was among the first dozen to own one in this vicinity. All the school children would gather around the car to see him start it. It was a ritual to do so and an extra man went along to crank the car, to help get it out of the mud holes and to lead a scary horse past the car. When driving an automobile in those days, it was the duty of the driver of the car to stop and lead the horse and buggy, wagon or rider on horseback, past the monster that the horse could not understand.

These pictures and information were in the Centennial Book, 1888-1988, which was celebrated in Fall of 1988 with Father Joseph Clauss as the Pastor.



Pictured here, **is Phillip Zinkan**, who was married to Anna Barbara "Hosfeld". Phillip was born on Aug. 23, 1804 and died on Dec. 28, 1876. He arrived in the United States in July, 1833, emigrating from Tyron, Ireland.



Pictured here, is Anna Barbara "Hosfeld" Zinkan, who married Phillip Zinkan. Anna was born on Dec. 11, 1811 and died on Jan. 30, 1884. She arrived in the United States in July, 1833, and emigrated from Tyron, Ireland.

Phillip & Anna Zinkan were the parents of Mary "Zinkan" Mackell, who was the mother of Louis Michaels, who was the father of Gus Michaels, who was the father of Elizabeth "Michaels" Kavanaugh. Hope this will help!
